


What is the profile of a Christ follower engaged in successful kingdom living? What does she or he look like, characteristically?





IV. Humble rather than Hypocritical



IV. Humble rather than Hypocritical




IV. Humble rather than Hypocritical






V. Reverent not Wasteful.


Do not give dogs what is holy, and do not throw your pearls before pigs, lest they trample them underfoot and turn to attack you.

V. Reverent not Wasteful.


"You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain. (Exodus 20:7)



(1 Peter 1:17-19)








VI. Obedient not Complacent.



(Matthew 7:13-14)






VII. Discerning rather than Naïve.






VII. Discerning rather than Naïve.




VII. Discerning rather than Naïve.
